The Statistical, Economic and Social Research and Training Centre for Islamic Countries (SESRIC), was founded as a subsidiary organ of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) in pursuance of Resolution No. 2/8-E adopted by the Eighth Islamic Conference of Foreign Ministers (ICFM), held in Tripoli in May 1977. The Centre started its activities in Ankara on 1 June 1978.

The basic mandate drawn up for SESRIC is threefold:

- To collate, process and disseminate socio-economic statistics and information on and for the utilisation of the member countries,
- To study and evaluate the economic and social developments in the member countries to help generate proposals that will initiate and enhance co-operation among them, and
- To organise training programmes in selected fields geared to the needs of the member countries as well as to the general objectives of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation.

At the threshold of its 40. year of existence and active involvement, within the framework of its field of specialisation, in the common effort towards the realisation of the noble objectives of the OIC, the Ankara Centre is increasingly solicited to put its accumulated experience and acquired know-how at the service of the Organisation and its member countries as reflected in the ever-expanding scope of activities it carries out.

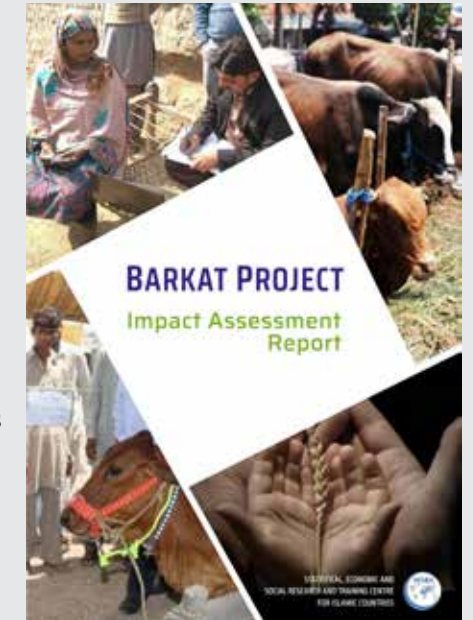
BARKAT PROJECT IMPACT ASSESSMENT REPORT 2017 by SESRIC

“Barkat Project” is a successful intervention in the field of “Poverty Alleviation”

The study was conducted by a research team led by Dr. Feryal Turan, Professor of Sociology at Ankara University and consisting of Dr. Mozharul Islam, Mr. Onur Çağlar and Ms. Burcu Topakba. This report was prepared by Dr. Mozharul Islam with contribution from Mr. Muhammed Yusuf Bilal Ata. The work was conducted under the general supervision of Mr. Mehmet Fatih Serenli, Director of Training and Technical Cooperation Department at SESRIC, who provided direction and comments.

Report concludes that...“It can be concluded that the Barkat Project is a successful project in the field of poverty alleviation and income diversity. It could be an example for the government and non-governmental organizations working in the sector of poverty alleviation and capacity building. In addition, special courses can be offered for the university students living in the selected area with a view to develop a system and properly utilize the cow dung in order to produce biogas for household consumption”.

Barkat Project is shri'ah complaint model project of The NGO World (TNW Foundation) that was initiated in 2012 in Pakistan to alleviate poverty through household livestock farming.



One Day Capacity Building Workshop at “International City and Civil Society Organisations” summit

Four Days Workshop on Nonprofit Leadership and Management

28 senior officials of 20 organizations successfully completed the four days training workshop jointly organized by The NGO World (INGOLAM) and SESRIC (OIC) in Islamabad from 2nd May 2017 to 5th May 2017.

The workshop helped the participants in broadening their horizons and helping them attain smooth transition to a bigger scale organization. The major focus of the workshop was on leadership roles & strategic planning, managing programs, relationships with stakeholders, team building, resource mobilization & sustainability, support functions and managing human and financial resources, as well as other relevant topics. The workshop enabled NGO’s leaders to learn their actual role and to improve managerial and structural areas of their organization. The purpose of the training workshop was to provide all participants with practical knowledge, skills, methods and tools that they could apply in the transformation of their own organizations. The training workshop also provided an excellent opportunity to foster networking between participants and exchange of experiences and approaches.

The session was a series of capacity building workshops for social sector in collaboration with SESRIC.
