RESPONSE

Reaching out to the devastated...

In a world torn by selfish motives, conflicts, hostilities, disasters, pain and misery, we rarely come across true compassion that is the driving force behind The NGO World. Irrespective of caste, creed or religion, these selfless and hardworking messiahs are perpetually engaged in a constant strife to uplift the poor and to help the troubled.

Although TNW had been serving as a networking e-platform for the NGOs since July 2009, it decided to be hands-on during the devastating floods of 2010, in Southern Punjab. RESPONSE team supported the flood hit population through provision of relief items, food, WASH facilities, rehabilitation of schools, revival of livelihood, and construction of homes. Their untiring and selfless efforts won them the very well-deserved accolades at all levels. There has been no looking back since then, and the TNW RESPONSE team has promptly responded to the sufferers of all natural and man-made disaster across Pakistan.

Floods 2010

Distribution of Relief Goods

During the relief phase of 2010 floods, TNW distributed around 230,000 relief item (food & non-food) of 356 types among more than 7711 affected families at 72 locations of Southern Punjab districts.



Restoring Livelihood of Carpet Weavers

In district Layyah, (UC: Kotla Haji Shah) floods 2010 destroyed 263 units of small scale household carpet industry, ending the livelihood of 1200 families. In response, TNW successfully completed the project of rebuilding 100 sheds, along with provision of related facilities for the most deserving beneficiaries thereby restoring the livelihood of 400 families.



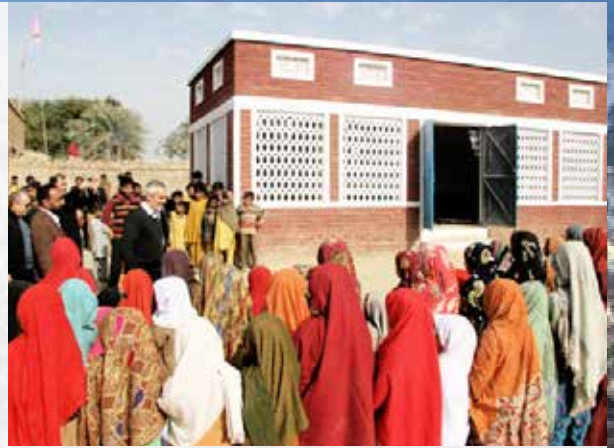
Clean Drinking Water for the Victims

With the support of WHO (World Health Organization), TNW team took 250 water samples from the affected areas of Layyah and Muzaffargarh districts to assess the biological contamination in drinking water. Consequently, 1000 Biosand Water filters were installed to ensure the availability of clean drinking water. Simultaneously awareness sessions about the need and use of safe drinking water were also conducted.



Rehabilitation of Feeder Schools

The 2010 Flood completely devastated 22 NCHD Feeder Schools, thus disrupting educational services for 1225 boys & girls. TNW took the responsibility to rebuild those schools and revive the educational setup for the students of far flung areas. Along with school building renovation & reconstruction, provision of furniture for teacher & students, stationary and bags was a major contribution.



Projects on Shelter

TNW designed two separate projects; shelters comprising of one and two rooms respectively.

Two Rooms Houses

These complete houses in Layyah district, comprise 02 bedrooms, a veranda, a kitchen and a bathroom. 30 Target beneficiaries were identified as the most needy and vulnerable; especially, shelter less widows, orphans, disabled or the poor parents with a large number of children particularly girls.



Single Room Houses

In this category TNW provided single room construction material, while benefitting 100 families of districts Muzaffargarh and Layyah.



Latrines and Hand Pumps

In district Layyah, 22 permanent latrines were constructed in schools with missing facilities. Hand pumps were also installed in the schools. These interventions facilitated the poor young students to have proper sanitation and drinking water source. In Basti Light House Layyah, TNW built 30 latrines and laid underground low cost sanitation system.



Free Health Camps

During and after the floods, the affectees, especially women and children face svere health issues. During the disaster response it was a routine activity of TNW to organize medical camps in the affected areas with provision of facilities like free checkup & medicines for the poor patients. Thousands received the benefits of these health care interventions.

Psycho Social Care

In Layyah TNW with the support of two organizations "HANDS" and "Basic Need" completed a small scale project of providing psycho social care to the 100 mentally ill people affected with post disaster stress.

Support for Livestock Farmers

TNW distributed fodder seed for livestock farmers of Rajanpur district. Seeds of multi-cut grass for 2000 acres were distributed among 1860 flood affected small livestock farmers.

Wheat Flour Distribution

In the 2010 Flood, many families lost their stored wheat. It was a big threat as wheat flour is the staple food for the affectees. To ease the looming disaster, TNW distributed 15000 KG of wheat flour amongst 750 affected families.

Place of Peace

TNW has completed the reconstruction of Jamia Masjid in Basti Chan (Ghazi Ghat, Tehsil KotAddu, district Muzaffargarh) with 600 person's capacity to offer Salah (Namaz). Kids of the area also attend their early Islamic lessons here. This Masjid was completely destroyed during the 2010 floods.

Research study with SANDEE

TNW consultant conducted a study titled "Targeting and Distribution of Post-Flood aid in Punjab, Pakistan. A Critical analysis", in the district Layyah and drafted a preliminary report regarding activities carried out in flood affected areas of Punjab, Pakistan and how these activities have helped in rehabilitation of flood affected communities.





Response to Earthquake 2015

The magnitude 7.5 earthquake that struck Badakshan Province, Afghanistan on 26 October, 2015, also rocked Pakistan ruthlessly.

After need assessment, The NGO World planned to distribute food packs among 300 affected families. In Shangla district, the packs were distributed directly among the 200 selected families based on their vulnerability, whereas in Bajour the government restrictions were followed and the food packs were handed over to FATA Disaster Management Authority.

Response to IDPs

TNW RESPONSE team distributed food items during the holy month of Ramadan among 500 IDP families of Waziristan at district Bannu (KP)



Participating in Disaster Management Exhibitions

The NGO World (TNW) Pakistan participated in the Disaster Management Exhibition 2011, 12, 14, 15, 16 with the objective to develop practical coordination among humanitarian agencies working in the field of disaster management. These exhibitions were managed by Centre for Disaster Preparedness and Management (CDPM) at University of Peshawar.





The NGO World (TNW)

TNW Programs

Greater Good

Under this program TNW aims to enhance and strengthen networking among stakeholders including social activists, development professionals, philanthropists and volunteers. To achieve this following major interventions have been started:

- » Purposeful and result oriented Social Media networking
- » Printed magazine to cover third sector i.e. Monthly Greater Good
- » Celebration of World NGO Day on 27th February every year and SWERA Awards.

INGOLAM

INGOLAM stands for "Institute of NGO Leadership And Management". It works like a brain of NGO sector. Under this program following major interventions are planned:

- » Capacity building of beginners and professionals of social & development sector
- » Research and designing of model projects & programs
- » Knowledge source for NGO sector

PATH

PATH is designed to target fresh PAKISTAN YOUTH. This program is dedicated for fresh graduates and youth. PATH aims to enlighten our youth by:

- » Regular training programs
- » Mentoring and Coaching
- » Internships and networking

ZEST

ZEST stands for "Zakaullah Educational Support and Training". This program is specifically designed to support education sector in following ways:

- » Scholarships for talented students from under served segments of society
- » Opening of ZEST schools; NON FORMAL basic education system
- » Research and teacher's training

BARKAT

Under this program TNW plans and executes initiatives of poverty reduction and sustainable livelihood for rural population including:

- » Distribute domestic animals to small livestock farmers on partnership basis
- » Make aware rural folks about their core issues and their sustainable solutions
- » Teach them about best use of their available natural resources

RIDA

RIDA stands for "Required Initiatives for Daughter's Access". As the name shows it is specifically designed for young girls and women. Under RIDA program following interventions have been planned and implemented:

- » Need based educational support activities
- » To impart income generating skills
- » Raise awareness about personal development and social issues

GIFT

Under this program TNW performs activities of social welfare and promote culture of charity to support ultra poor, widows, orphans, poor patients, disables and other suppressed & oppressed segments of society. Major activities of GIFT include:

- » Distribution of food boxes especially in Ramadan Kareem
- » Execution of Qurbani project on occasion of Eid-ul-Adha and deliver meat gifts to poor and deserving postulation.
- » Financial support to poor patients and provision of accessories to poor students

RESPONSE

Under this program TNW responds to human sufferings in emergency and disastrous situations as a first response unit with its limited resources all over the Pakistan. Following are the major interventions:

- » Provision of Relief/NFIs and recovery of livelihood
- » Construction of permanent shelter and rehabilitation of education facilities
- » WASH and health related interventions
